- Oversee the Park and Trail Partnership Program, a \$500,000 capacity-building grants program for Friends groups
- Work with state park and historic site Friends groups to improve networking and sharing of information and to build their organizational capacity
- Work with park groups and parks agency partners to organize and promote a statewide "I Love My Park" day
- Promote a vigorous agenda on parks issues
- Advocate among opinion leaders and decision makers for improved stewardship and increased and new sources of government and private funding for parks
- Supervise Program Coordinator and Arthur V. Savage Intern
